The Habitat Critical Home Repair Program identifies homes with unsafe and woefully inadequate living conditions. Like Habitat's new home construction projects, sponsors (such as PPC) contribute money, materials and labor for repairs. Mr. Mason is in desperate need of our help to repair the deck, build a handicap ramp and complete kitchen and bathroom repairs that include new flooring, cabinets, etc. We will begin work on November 5 and will follow the schedule listed below. # **Charlotte Rescue Mission Thanksgiving Dinner Drive**

It's our favorite time of year - time to support our neighbors with a Thanksgiving Dinner to feed four. Last year, we provided funds for over 100 Turkeys & 100 complete boxes with all the sides. Our goal this year is to meet & exceed last year! Through our partnership with Charlotte Rescue mission, we help provide a Thanksgiving meal for those who might not otherwise have one. Collectively, we will help CRM to support 21 non-profit agencies and eight (8) Title 1 schools, providing meals to approximately 6,000 families.

We have streamlined our process over the years, making it easy & more efficient to participate. Instead of creating a complete box, we suggest bringing sets of 10 individual items. Items can be brought in anytime once registered with the sign-up genius link below but by Friday, November 14<sup>th</sup> at the latest. Also, this year, we are suggesting a \$25 check/cash offering per turkey. CRM will use these funds to buy in bulk from their vendor. Online payments through our website can be done with turkeys in the Gift note. Checks can also be done made out to PPC with turkeys in the memo line. Checks or cash envelopes may be placed in the Outreach box in the church office, given to Ruth, our office manager, or given to me personally. Products can be placed in the foyer of the CLC. # **Reformation Sunday:**

Reformation is the last Sunday of October each year. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Martin Luther was deeply troubled by the abuses that he saw in the Catholic Church, which he discussed in great detail in his 95 Theses. Luther hoped that the church would be open to reform from within, but Luther was ultimately excommunicated for his dissent, so his followers started the Lutheran Church. Presbyterians, Methodists, Episcopalians, Baptists, and many other denominations were established during the Reformation. On Reformation Sunday, we celebrate our history as part of Protestant Reformation and the continuing work that God is doing through the ministry of the church.
