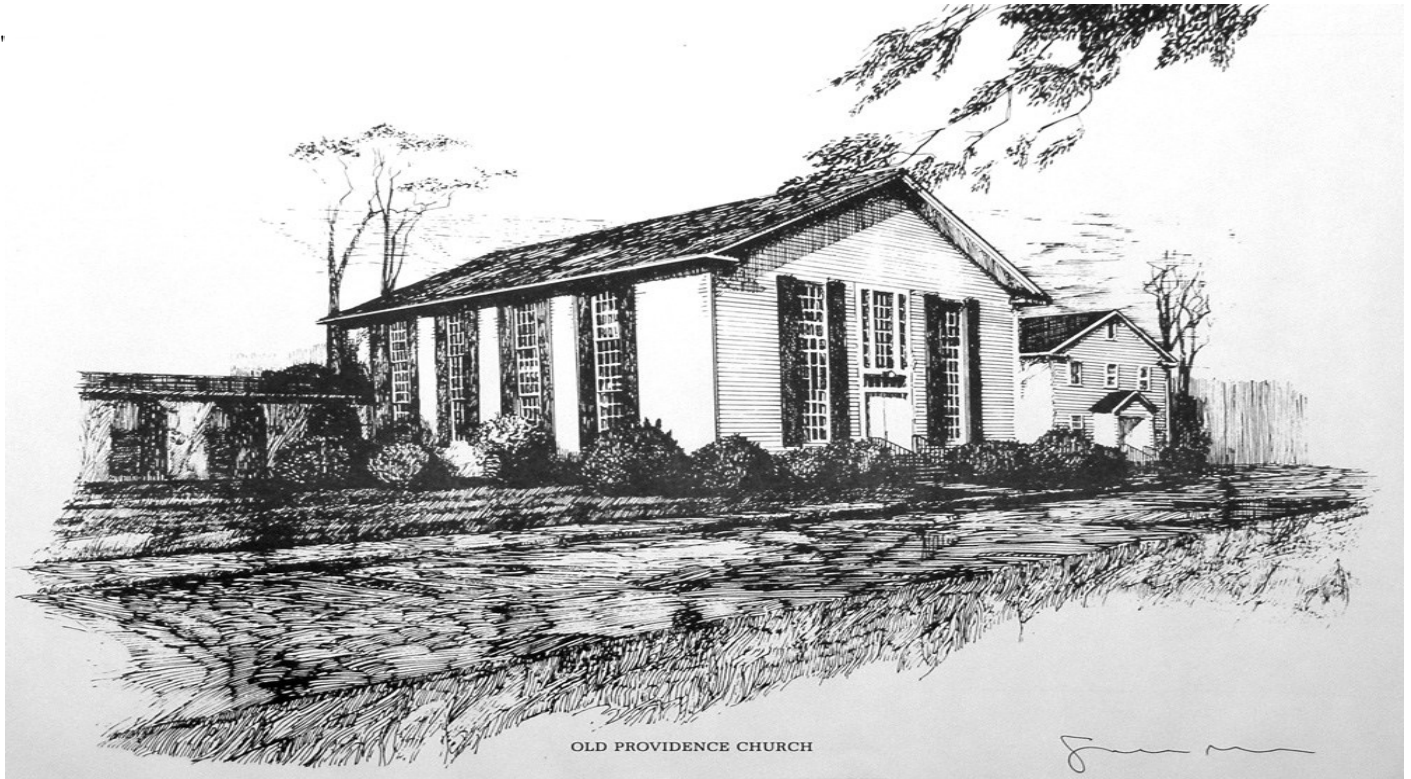

Community Outreach for January: Nourish Up

January's Community Outreach Committee focus is on Nourish Up. Nourish Up is a merger of Loaves and Fishes and Friendship Trays, as these two local, stellar organizations have joined forces and are now under one roof and one name. Providence has a long history with both of these organizations. Nourish Up provides a week's worth of groceries to individuals and families experiencing a short-term crisis with a network of pantries throughout Mecklenburg County and home delivery of groceries by volunteers. **They also** deliver nutritious meals to the elderly or infirm individuals who are unable to obtain or prepare their own meals, while also providing a human connection to the isolated and lonely and peace of mind to their families. PPC now has its own route delivering meals to 6-7 individuals who live near our church. Seventeen church members have volunteered and are delivering meals. This means that every weekday for the foreseeable future, a church member will be delivering meals to neighbors in our community who are in need of a nutritious meal.

We all know that we are a caring congregation. It is so great to see that this caring is not just directed towards each other but also outward toward our neighbors.

Volunteer Opportunity #2

The volunteer opportunity for this week is joining the PPC team, delivering meals to our neighbors. Here is how it works: Meal pick up is at Sardis Presbyterian Church at 10:30 am. Typically, you would have 5-7 meals to deliver which would take about 1.5 hours. The route is within a few miles of the church. All church members are assigned to the same route which makes it easier to switch dates when going out of town or because of illness (though if you can't find someone with whom to switch, you can notify the Nourish Up office, and they will send a sub). Presently we have some open slots. You can sign up for one day or two days a month.

New Year, Same Promises January and February Sermon Series

Every time the calendar changes to a new year, we feel we have the opportunity for a fresh start. A number of us will make new year's resolutions, such as changes to our diet, exercise, habits, or lifestyle, but in spite of those resolutions, most things stay the same for us. This may be a cause of disappointment, but there is some constants that we can celebrate. God's promises to us do not change when the calendar moves to a new year. We can depend on God, day by day, year after year. Many of the promises that we read in the Bible are relevant to us today. We will reflect together in the new year on celebrating God's consistent and dependable promises. This sermon series is inspired by the book *A Preacher's Guide to Lectionary Sermon Series* (this section is written by Katherine Willis Pershey).

February 1: Matthew 5:1-12. God's Promise of Blessing. Jesus offers nine Beatitudes, ways that we are spiritually blessed when we face difficulties or adversities. The promise of the Beatitudes is for something good to emerge from the dust of the hardships we face. What does it mean for us to be blessed by God? 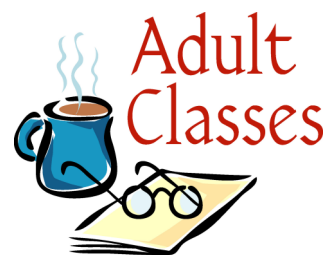
