

New on-line giving platform! (yes, another change).

PPC is changing to Servant Keeper Online Giving. The letter below explains how to transition, with an instructional video link included. This change should allow for better record keeping, financial savings, and new giving features in the future. We appreciate your support through this transition.

Dear PPC Members,

We are excited to announce that Providence is upgrading our giving platform to better serve our congregation and community. As part of this upgrade, we are transitioning from our current giving platform to the new Servant Keeper Online Giving Platform. Servant Keeper is the computer system we use at Providence to provide a database for our members and financial records.

What you Need to Know:

1. Transition Dates: The transition to Servant Keeper Online Giving will take place on 5/31/2025. After this date, our previous giving platform will no longer be available.

2. How to Transition:

Step 1: Visit our church website www.providencepresclt.org

Step 2: Look for the "Give" tab

Step 3: Click on the link to access our new Servant Keeper Online Giving platform.

Step 4: Follow the instructions on the screen to create your account or login

if you already have a Servant Keeper account via our online Church directory. A new password is required for new and existing accounts.
